2024 SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS

- 1. The <u>deadline</u> for completing the <u>online</u> application, required documentation, college transcript and essays* is <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 3</u>, <u>2024</u>. <u>enontab.org/resources/online</u> <u>registration/scholarships</u> or <u>https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=enontab</u>
- 2. Read the criteria for each scholarship carefully. You will be considered for all the scholarships that you fulfill all the requirements for. You only need to submit one application.

ALL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS MUST SATISFY THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS

- 3. Please submit/upload your most recent official transcript at the time of your application submission (Fall 2023 for current students). You must complete and submit the online application and all other required application data <u>by the stated deadline</u> to be considered for a scholarship.
- 4. Enon church membership is a requirement Scholarships are for Enon members only. Student/applicant <u>must</u> be a member of ETBC for a minimum of one (1) year as of September 1, 2024 (membership marked as the date of baptism of your baptism/right-hand of fellowship at Enon). You <u>must</u> provide your Enon Envelope Number on the application form. Applicants must have participation in ministries at Enon.

NOTE: Some scholarships require a longer period of membership.

- 5. **All scholarship applicants** <u>must</u> provide a <u>student resume</u> along with the application and other required documentation as stated in each scholarship's criteria. Included in this packet is a sample resume. You do not have to follow the model, but your resume should include the following, with dates of involvement:
 - a. University/College with Major and GPA
 - b. Enon youth ministries during your high-school years, if applicable
 - c. Extra-curricular college/school activities
 - d. Community Service during your college years provide written verification, if possible, on agency/organization letterhead
 - e. Employment
 - f. Awards & honors

6. One (1) Essay is required to fulfill the minimum standard requirement for all applicants to be considered for all the scholarships. In the appropriate section of the online application, enter the **Required Essay.**

*NOTE: Many of the scholarships criteria require <u>additional</u> specific information in the essay. To be considered for those scholarships, your essay must include the requested topic within the body of the essay. Every applicant <u>must</u> submit, at th<u>e minimum</u>, the required essay. We also urge every applicant to include the specified additional topics within the essay; thereby increasing the number of scholarships for which you are eligible.

- a. ESSAY The purpose of the Required Essay is to help us to know you better beyond your scholastic achievements that are shown in your transcript and test scores. The essay should not exceed 750 words. Each applicant must submit the one required essay to fulfill the essay requirement for all the scholarships. Carefully read all the scholarships' essay requirements and address them within your essay. Be sure to include all the topics/items required for each scholarship you wish to be considered for within the essay. At a minimum, your essay should address each (all) of the following:
 - Academic Accomplishments
 - Academic Challenges
 - Activities in school, community and at Enon. Tell how these activities have positively impacted your life
 - Family include parental/household make-up, siblings, parental support, problems
 - Life Changes drastic changes, both positive and challenging, in your life (i.e. economic hardship, illness/disease, change of address/school, separation and/or divorce)
 - Future Goals include career goals, employment, college choice, college major, continuing education (graduate/professional schools)
- 7. <u>All</u> students are encouraged to apply. This packet contains information for scholarships available at time of printing. However, it is possible for additional scholarships to become available before the selection period. Fulfilling the criteria for all scholarships will greatly increases your chances of receiving a scholarship.
- 8. Scholarship recipients may be asked to participate in future Scholarship Ministry's events and workshops.

- 10. Selected applicants only will receive a letter, via postal mail or email, informing them that they have been selected to receive a scholarship. The letter will NOT indicate which scholarship(s) the applicant was awarded. Currently the service is scheduled for Saturday, June 8, 2024. The date confirmation and details concerning the 2024 announcement service of scholarship recipients will be included in the notification letter sent to the recipients.

Sample Required Essay

*This is sample for a high school senior demonstrates incorporation of data for Required essay and inclusions for some scholarships as their criteria requires.

"The greatest glory in living lies not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall." Nelson Mandela

As I begin to reflect on my high school experience, I realize that many of the accomplishments I am most proud were built on the back of failures unseen. My transcript and awards speak to my accomplishments, but in refection if I had not fallen a few times and decided to get back up, none of those accolades would be possible.

I am recovering from math phobia. Even if it is not a real phobia according to Webster's dictionary, it is real to me. I never performed poorly in mathematics, but in elementary school I did well because I was able to plug in numbers. When I got to high school, I was unable to just use formulas to get good grades. Teachers began to ask me the "why" behind the answer and I began to drown. I was taught to figure out answers, and I was good at that task. When I was asked in my pre-calculus class to explain my answers in a deeper way, I became frustrated. What difference did it make why the answer was the answer?

I am the oldest of four siblings and my parents have instilled in all of us the importance of education. The sympathy I looked for at home wasn't there. They told me to pray, study and communicate with my teacher. So, I did. I went to school and began to ask questions and study harder and slowly the cloud of confusion lifted. That first semester of pre-calculus I earned my first C in a mathematics course ever! I was very proud of this grade because the journey I traveled to earn that grade was truly my own. By the end of the course I had an A-, and that is all that appears on my transcript, but I am more proud of my process than the grade I earned by the end.

I am a proud member of Enon and I am grateful for the opportunities my church has afforded me. The major lesson I learned from all the tournaments I lost, competitions in which I didn't place first and even the sermons from one Sunday to next are that of resiliency. If Jesus Christ could die so that I could live, then I should live this life to the fullest. There is no way I can quit or speak of what I can't do with the example of love He provided.

In conclusion, I am proud of what my transcripts and awards say about my character. My transcript doesn't speak of my future aspirations, dreams and strong will to succeed. I will one day be an educator who will impact the community I came from. Although I know that I will not become a millionaire with this career choice, I will be able to give back a small portion of the hope and dreams that were given to me.

ETBC COLLEGE SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church Endowment Fund)

Two (2) \$5,000 non-renewable scholarships are available to 2 college students who are full-time students attending an accredited institution. They will be awarded to high-achieving fall 2024 college seniors.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- ETBC member for a minimum of 2 years
- Must be a Senior in Fall 2024, completed 90 credit hours
- Minimum academic GPA 3.0
- History of ETBC youth ministry involvement, preferred must complete Enon Church Ministry Form section of online application
- Participation in ministry and/or college/community service as a college student, include in your required essay
- Letter of recommendation from college professor and/or community service organization
- Include in Required Essay why you chose your major/career field

ETBC COLLEGE JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP

- Minimum academic GPA 3.0
- History of ETBC youth ministry involvement, preferred must complete Enon Church Ministry Form section of online application
- Participation in ministry and/or college/community service as a college student, include in your required essay
- Letter of recommendation from college professor and/or community service organization
- Include in required essay why you chose your major/career field

ETBC COLLEGE SOPHOMORE SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church Endowment Fund)

There are **2 \$5,000** non-renewable scholarships available to 2 college students who are full-time students attending an accredited institution. They will be awarded to high-achieving fall 2024 college sophomores.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- ETBC member for a minimum of 2 years
- Must be a Sophomore in Fall 2024, completed 30 credit hours
- Minimum academic GPA 3.0
- History of ETBC youth ministry involvement, preferred must complete Enon Church Ministry Form section of online application
- Participation in ministry and/or college/community service as a college student, include in your required essay
- Letter of recommendation from college professor and/or community service organization

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Completed a minimum of 30 credit hours with a minimum academic GPA of 2.75

ETBC LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church Endowment Fund)

This **\$2,000** non-renewal scholarship is for a college student who demonstrated outstanding leadership skills while participating in service to the church, the college and/or the community.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Minimum academic GPA of 3.0 or higher
- History of participation in youth ministry at ETBC or mission work preferred; must complete Enon Church Ministry Form section of online application
- Engaged in community service, provide signed documentation, on official stationery from the organization, stating your volunteerism/contributions to the community
- Recommendation from ministry, college or community organization
- Essay or resume should mention leadership experiences and extracurricular activities

HUGEE INVESTMENT SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Brother Byron and Sister Jacqulynn Hugee)

This *\$2,000* non-renewable scholarship will be awarded to full-time college students who will be rising sophomores, juniors or seniors in college. The Hugees understand that the financial hardships of remaining in college after freshman year can be difficult for many students. To address this issue, they are offering to invest in those college students to assist those students to allow them to remain in school, complete their course of study, and receive their college degree.

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Minimum academic GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Involvement in Extra-Curricular Activities at school (i.e. sports, leadership, etc.)
- Include in required essay a discussion of unique circumstances (i.e. first
 generation college student, single parent household, child of immigrant(s) etc.)
 NOTE: Preference given to students majoring in religion, psychology,
 political science, education or Black Studies. These are preference majors,
 not requirements

AUBREY B. JONES, JR. ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Sister Diane Branch Jones and Family)

This *\$2,000* non-renewable scholarship in loving memory of Brother Aubrey B. Jones, Jr., who was among the first Black students to graduate from the University of Virginia School of Engineering. Aubrey Jones was the project manager/administrator for the construction of Enon East building project-freely giving his expertise, knowledge, and time. He also worked as the first Black professional in many major companies, was an author, and developed an educational program used by the Philadelphia School District.

This scholarship is awarded to a worthy full-time undergraduate who is majoring in engineering. He or she should have a good grade point average, participates or volunteers in a church or community activity to give back. He or she must have a positive attitude and believe that he or she will meet their goal.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Required Essay include the life challenges you have and/or are having, including financial hardship/need
- Single-Parent Household, preferably (include in essay)
- Major in Engineering, preferably

DEACONS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by the Deacon Ministry of Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church)

This *\$1,500* non-renewable scholarship is sponsored by the Deacon Ministry in memory of all deceased Enon deacons. The scholarship is available to a full-time college student attending an accredited institute.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Completed a minimum of 30 credit hours with a minimum academic GPA of 2.75

GEORGE W. and MARIE C. GUNTER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Sister Karin M. Gunter, Brian G. Gunter and Minister Kim Gunter Upshaw)

This **\$1,500** non-renewable scholarship is in memory of George W. and Marie C. Gunter, who were the parents of Brian, Karin, Kim and the late Bruce Gunter. George and Marie taught each of their children the importance of God, family and education.

This scholarship is available to a full-time *African American female student majoring in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM), with a preference for mathematics major.*

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Female Student
- Majoring in STEM subjects with preference for Mathematics major

E. LEE RICHARDSON, SR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Brother Everett & Sister Gloria Richardson)

This *\$1,500* non-renewable scholarship is in memory of E. Lee Richardson, Sr. who was a fervent believer in education. In addition to providing for the education of his three children, he also financed or assisted in the financing of the education of several members of his extended family.

This scholarship is available to a full-time African-American student who has completed his/her first year in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics **(STEM)** curriculum.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Minimum academic GPA of 2.5 or more
- Majoring in a STEM curriculum

II TIMOTHY 1:7 SCHOLARSHIP

(Anonymously Sponsored)

This *\$1,500* non-renewable scholarship focuses on II Timothy 1:7, a bible verse that reminds us what God is like and what God's gift is like.

It will be awarded to a full-time undergraduate student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 at an accredited institution.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Essay include your life events or changes that helped shaped you into the person you are now. Also include in your essay a paragraph on what II Timothy 1:7 means to you
- Minimum academic GPA 3.0 or higher
- Regular church attendance while at college. Provide, preferably, a letter from the church on official stationery verifying your regular attendance. If you don't have a letter, provide the name and address of the church.

WILLIAM WAYNE HARDY SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Sister Jyllian Hardy)

NEW in 2024. This **new \$1,000** non-renewable scholarship is in honor of the lives of her father and uncle. Her father is a fierce advocate for education and ensured that she obtained the best education possible. Her uncle was creative in finding ways to give back to the black community and promote excellence through education. These men are the inspiration behind this scholarship.

This scholarship is available to a full-time college student who has completed at least two years in an accredited college.

For this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Minimum academic G.P.A. of 2.5 or more
- Must be at least a junior undergraduate student

<u>DEVON J. PENDERGRASS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – ACCOUNTING EDUCATION</u> (Sponsored by Brother Jerry and Minister Francina Pendergrass)

NEW in 2024. This **new \$1,000** non-renewable scholarship is in memory of Devon J. Pendergrass, who was the loving son of Jerry and Francina Pendergrass. This 'good citizen' scholarship is available to an undergraduate college student, attending an accredited institution of higher education on a full-time basis, majoring in **Accounting or Education**. The student must demonstrate academic achievement combined with an exemplary attitude demonstrated through contributions to school and community.

For this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Minimum G.P.A. of 2.5 or more
- History of volunteer work at school and in the community include in your required essay.
- Provide signed documentation, on official stationery from school and/or organization, stating your volunteerism/contributions to school and/or community.
- Major in Accounting or Education
- Additional preference given to members of ROTC, US Army National Guard

GEROME M. CANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Sister Dorothy White Cannon)

This *\$1,000* non-renewable scholarship was established by Dorothy White Cannon, in memory of her son Gerome M. Cannon. Gerome M. Cannon was a dedicated Informational Technology professional. This scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate student, preferably majoring in Information Technology, Computer Science or another related IT field..

This scholarship is available to a full-time undergraduate student who is continuing their studies at an accredited 2 or 4 year institution.

To be considered for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum Standard Criteria
- Required Essay
- Information Technology, Computer Science, IT field major, preferably

BARBARA CARR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Sponsored by Deacon Nate Carr)

This \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship is in memory of Barbara Carr, who was the loving wife of Deacon Nate Carr and a long-time Enon member with an extraordinary love and dedication for children. Sister Carr served Enon with the distinction of being the first female servant leader of the Trustee Ministry. It is available to a full-time student *majoring in Early Childhood Education*.
